


Thyroid Eye Disease: ASSESSING, TREATING, AND CO-MANAGING A CONDITION OF GRAVE CONCERN

OVERVIEW

Thyroid eye disease (TED) is a multifactorial autoimmune disease with a wide spectrum of signs and symptoms. Due to its heterogeneity in clinical presentation as well as a failure on the part of health care providers to understand the relationship between TED and hyperthyroidism, it is frequently misdiagnosed. Further, newer treatment options may offer additional benefits to patients with TED. Ophthalmologists treating TED often collaborate with endocrinologists in terms of evaluation as well as clinical and surgical decision-making. This educational activity—a live virtual satellite symposium at the 43rd Annual Meeting of the European Thyroid Association (ETA)—will cover optimal multidisciplinary care and the best practices for treating patients with TED.
